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Easter

Easter Sunday in 1970 fell on March 29, and we were all excited about the Easter Egg hunt we would be having when we got home from church. It was our first year in Muncie, and our “new to us” house had a large front yard and a $\frac{3}{4}$ acre backyard – the prospects were exciting.

My sister, Amy, had just turned 11, my brother, Paul, and I were getting ready to celebrate turning 16 and 4 the next month. Amy and I were settling in to our new schools (Storer Junior High and Muncie Central back in those days), Paul would head off to Kindergarten in the fall – there had been a lot of changes and adjustments, but we were learning about the new patterns and people.

The day before the great hunt we all sat around the kitchen table, and I carefully boiled the Paas color tabs to melt them down and pour into bowls so we could dye eggs. Amy was helping Paul bend the little wire holders that came in the kit into the right shape to hold the hard-boiled eggs, and the drying racks were all set – padded with extra paper towels to catch the drips.

Like good, bossy, big sisters, Amy and I were regaling Paul with all the “proper” techniques for egg dyeing – how long to leave the eggs in the color bath, how frequently to turn them to get a good, even color. As always, Paul sat patiently through our instructions, then grabbed an egg and dived into the process.

“Good first start,” Amy and I thought from the vantage point of our vast years of experience. “Pretty blue, good coverage” . . . then we gasped with shock when Paul carefully put a second egg in his wire holder and held it so that only half of the egg was in the dye. What in the world was he doing? He was breaking all the rules of egg dyeing!

We were even more astounded when he pulled the half-dyed egg up, let it drip dry, turned the egg over and submerged the other half IN A DIFFERENT COLOR! Unbelievable! Scandalous! Who ever heard of someone doing that!?!

Even more scandalous was the day of the actual hunt, when almost-4-year-old Paul took his basket, went out into the big backyard and carefully searched – only for his special egg. “Look, here’s one,” I would call out. “I’m o.k.,” Paul would shout across the yard. Finally, he found his special two-tone egg and returned to sit on the edge of the porch and watch us search for the others. “Come on, Paul,” I’d try again, “there are a lot more eggs to find!” “I’m good,” Paul called back with a gentle smile on his face, “I’ve found what I was looking for.”

Each Easter since then, I’ve tried to imagine myself at another Easter, ages ago, when a young man in the prime of his life scandalized the world by doing everything in a different way – God’s way. His life had been a constant demonstration of new ways to see the world and one another. His death on a criminal’s cross should have been the end, yet, on that first Easter, it was a new beginning – or maybe I should say a continuing – of ways to see with fresh eyes and changed hearts. And each Easter since, each of us is given a chance again to look into the empty tomb where Christ once lay, and smile gently, and say to the pressures of a broken world, “I’m fine. I’ve found what I was looking for. Want to come and see?”

WORSHIP

What Led to this Capital Campaign?

2014 – After a year in which we had a team attending monthly gatherings as part of Step One in the Fruitful Congregation, we had a Consultation Team come into our church in the fall of 2014. This team reported to us in the middle of November, 2014.

January 1, 2015 – We had eight teams formed to respond to the FCJ report and to envision where we might go as a church in several ministry areas.

Winter, Spring, Summer, 2015 – The teams met to do their work and to report. We also had workshops to assist us, and Dr. Doug Anderson met for over a year with leaders of these teams and with Pastor Dale to coach us along in the process.

Summer, 2015 - The Children's Ministry Team, having been meeting with a special consultant, proposed that we move all of our children ministries to just one floor rather than have them split on the ground floor and the third floor. The Youth Ministries Team also proposed some changes to the Youth Area.

July 29, 2015 – The Church Council heard the reports from the various FCJ Ministry Teams and authorized the formation of a Facilities Investigation Team to explore and report upon the feasibility and costs related to the proposals from the Children's FCJ

Team and the Youth FCJ Team. The Church Council also heard that the three-year "Moving Into the Future Campaign" had been completed (Tuckpointing, Stevenson Center, and Organ Renovation). It was reported at this time that we had only \$92,788 remaining to pay on the work done. This represented less than half of the loan from our Foundation for the work on the Stevenson Center. At this time we also reported we had \$83,856.14 on hand in the Campaign Fund with \$19,182.64 in outstanding pledges.

Fall, 2015 – A Facilities Investigation Team was formed to determine if and how best we could move all of the children to one floor. This team included representatives from the Children's Ministry Team, the Trustees, music ministry, and some people at-large. Examining room sizes and recent attendance figures for the various Sunday School classes, the Facilities Investigation Team proposed that we actively explore moving all of the children to the ground floor.

April, 2016 – The Board of Trustees reported some good estimates on the work to be done to fulfill the proposals from both the Children's and Youth's FCJ Teams. Also that month we accepted the resignation of our then Business Administrator, entered into a time of financial uncertainty, and discovered along the way that much of the remaining funds for the first capital campaign that had been reported in July had been expended to cover operational expenses of the church. The proposals were put on hold until we could determine where we were financially.

Wednesday, November 23, 2016 – We discover that both boilers are not functioning. Given the Thanksgiving holiday, despite the conscientious endeavors of our repair service on both that Wednesday and Friday, we had to cancel Sunday services on November 27. The Trustees, now Property Committee, began investigating the best thing to do with our boilers.

January 24, 2017 – The proposal from the Property Committee to replace our two old boilers with two new, more efficient boilers was presented to the Finance Committee and was approved. The Finance Committee also approved the formation of a Capital Campaign Task Force.

February 20, 2017 – The Capital Campaign Task Force with representation from the Property Committee, the Finance Committee, Children’s Ministry, and Music Ministry met to sketch out a campaign to target \$300,000 to be raised with the Commitment Sunday to be April 16.

February 21, 2017 – The Property Committee formally approved the purchase of two new boilers and added \$10,000 for painting, carpeting, and ceiling tiles for the Youth Area.

February 26, 2017 – Pastor Dale incorporated the campaign for \$300,000 and on April 16 as the Commitment Sunday.

February 28, 2017 – The Finance Committee met and amended the campaign to target \$280,000 with the Commitment Sunday to be April 30.

March 6, 2017 – The Church Council met and approved the Capital Campaign of \$280,000 with the Commitment Sunday to be April 30.

What is this Capital Campaign?

This is a two-year campaign with two very immediate targets and one longer range target:

1. We want to replace the two boilers toward the end of this April to the first part of May. Our hope is that we will not require heating or air conditioning at that time of the year. **Therefore, we need to raise \$107,035 by the end of this April 2017.**
2. We want to locate our children’s ministries areas all onto the ground floor and spruce up the youth area. In moving the children all on the ground floor, we will relocate the choir room to the second floor, offering more needed space for the choir and their music. We want to do this work primarily after VBS is over. **Therefore, we need to raise almost \$60,000 by the end of this June 2017.**
3. We need to retire the remaining portion of our loan from our High Street Foundation over the next two years. **Therefore, we need to raise \$92,788 by the end of March, 2019.**

Commitment Sunday will be April 30, 2017.

How May I Learn About This Capital Campaign?

In addition to mailings that will go out, there will be two informational meetings:

Monday, April 10, at 6:30 p.m.

Saturday, April 22, at 10:00 a.m.

How Are We Doing So Far in This Campaign?

The Finance Committee reported to the Church Council that we have over \$53,000 toward this campaign. This total includes some Trustee funds and a generous gift from Update Learning of over \$15,000.

In addition, we have been informed of a generous gift that should exceed \$30,000 to be used toward locating the children's ministries onto the ground floor.

The Church Council members have received a letter challenging them to lead the way by returning their commitment cards by April 2.

What Can We Do?

1. **PRAY.** We already have evidence of God being at work in this. Please join in thanking God and in praying his ongoing support of this church.
2. **CONTINUE YOUR REGULAR GIVING.** Just like in our homes we depend upon our paychecks or pension checks or Social Security checks to provide for our daily needs, we in the church depend upon our regular giving to support the ongoing ministry and facility bills that we face each month. We are already at a time when we are straining to meet these normal obligations and cannot afford to slack off in this area.
3. **PRAY AGAIN.** This time pray about how you might support this one-time need that goes beyond our normal budget.
4. **RETURN YOUR COMMITMENT CARD.** This card will be mailed in April and provide each of us an opportunity to support first the replacement of the boilers, then the work on our rooms, and then finally the repayment of the balance of the loan.

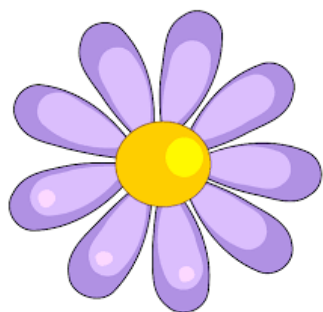
