Changes and Promises

Like many other folk, fall is my favorite season of the year. I love it when the air gets crisp and cool, and the sky shines bright blue. I love it when the leaves begin to change color and the woods take on a whole new personality and distinction. I love looking at the birds beginning to practice for their migratory flights. And I even love the dust rising from corn and bean fields as the harvest progresses.

But fall is definitely a reminder of change. Not only does nature take on a whole, new look, but, in this area of our country, the earth prepares itself for a cold winter's rest. The stark contrast between the fertile, warm, growing season and

howling winds with flying snow is tempered by a time to reflect and regroup as change marches on.

At High Street, we are going through times of change. New uses for rooms all over the building (thanks to the generous Home and Hearth Campaign givers and the hard-working Trustees), new relationships forming, new visions for worship and music, new programs for children and youth. A lot of change – and, potentially, a lot of confusion and chaos.

On October 29, I hope you will all join us for a single service at 10:00, celebrating God's promises of new life. The children and families of Angels on High will join all ages of our High Street children and youth in recalling God's promises through the ages, and God's faithfulness to fulfill those promises in amazing ways. There will be singing, scripture, story and hope – glorifying the God of new possibilities.

We all are looking forward to some fun adventures in October! We will celebrate the fall season with our fall parties, along with attending various fall related field trips such as, Jacobs Orchard & Whitetail Tree Farm . Preschool Sunday & Open Houses will be held at the end of this month and are a great way for our preschool families to visit our preschool and enjoy fellowship.

As our preschool and PDO continues to grow, so do our needs of consumable supplies. We can always use donations of packaged snacks, Lysol disinfecting spray, baby wipes and paper towels! We thank you in advance for your donations.

Lead and Serve in our Children or Youth Ministries

There are different ways to serve in our Children and Youth ministries. Prayerfully consider if one of these options as a way to serve and glorify God through His children and youth!

1. Lead Once a Month or Monthly: Leaders who serve in this way will be in a classroom with K-2nd, 3rd-5th, 6th-8th, or 9th-12th. General responsibilities are greeting parents at check-in and leading our children/ youth in the lesson. Children's lesson are 30 minutes and Youth lessons are 45 minutes. All leaders will receive the lesson of the week from Kasey Needham,

The Director of Children and Youth Ministries, on the Monday prior to leading. If there are any activities for the week, Kasey will have the materials prepared in advance. During the week, Kasey would be available to answer your questions or walk you through the plan!

2. Lead Rotation Stations: We currently offer 3 hands-on activities to help our children K-5th grade to grow in their faith through Science activities, Bible storytelling, and learning what it means to be a disciple with Jr. Disciple. These leaders serve once a month and work with children K-5th. We know God is in all things. Do you enjoy baking, missions, crafting, recreation, etc? God is there!

3. Support The Grove: Come and talk with our youth at The Grove, Sundays from 5-7! Learn about them, share stories, and get to know them! There are multiple ways to serve like providing: a meal, chatting about our week and everyday life, playing games together, and studying with us!

4. Pray! Pray with us as we love, encourage, and come alongside our children and youth as they grow in faith and knowledge! Pray for all the children, youth, parents, schools, pastors, and the many others who live into these young people's lives!

5. Invite! Word of mouth is the best way to spread the news and we are called to share our faith! Invite friends, family, and the community to Church! Share your enthusiasm with them about why you go to church and how it has changed your life!

Foundation Facts

Foundation Facts: The Foundation always welcomes donations. Unless the donor specifies, the donation is placed in the Unrestricted Fund.

Congress has made permanent the opportunity to make a gift from an IRA account –tax-free!

HOW IT WORKS:

1. Your gift must be transferred directly from your IRA account to High Street.
2. You must be at least 70 ½ years old.
3. The contribution must be an outright gift.
4. You can transfer up to \$100,000 per year.
5. If you haven't already taken your required minimum distribution in a given year, a qualifying rollover gift can count toward meeting this requirement.
6. Your IRA transfer generates neither taxable income nor a tax deduction, so you benefit even if you do not itemize your taxes.
7. As always discuss any gifts with your tax professional.



Muncie Bash Festival

October 2017 marks the 500th anniversary of events by which Martin Luther sparked a Reformation in 1517. Luther argued for greater participation of the congregation in worship, and specifically in communal singing. This alteration significantly shaped

what we now consider to be the standard in choral music through to the present day: the voice of the people raised in harmony. As perhaps the most prominent Lutheran composer, Johann Sebastian Bach composed several "Reformation" cantatas for the church he served in Leipzig. You can hear these three works this October in performances by various singers and players throughout our Muncie community. Each cantata is led by Andrew Crow.
