How God Sees Us

The Red Box movie dispenser has become my best friend. Red Box movie dispensers can be found at most Marsh Supermarket or McDonald's restaurants. It has become my best friend because I can get almost any movie released in the last year or so for a little over a dollar plus tax—what a deal! That's not all! I can go to the company's web site and search for movies and reserve my selections at any Red Box Movie dispenser nationwide!

However, best friends can let us down sometimes. My local Red Box vending machine let me down because I had already rented all of its "shoot 'em up" movies, and had to settle for a type of movie I would normally not reach for. There are so many other things I could have done that night rather than watch a movie, and the fact that I could not find what I was looking for could have been a "sign" that I should have been focused on something else, but that \$1.30 was "burning a hole" in my debit card.

I ended up picking a movie about a widower and his four adult children that told the story of how each one of the children bowed out, at the last minute, of a family cookout he had planned. The name of the movie is unimportant, but what happened after his disappointment spoke volumes about the love he had for his children. This family gathering was important to the father because he had things to share with each person. He had the same message for each one of them worded according to the personality of each child. But, since they could not be there this did not happen.

Robert De Niro played the father in

this movie, and his character set off on a cross-country road trip to see each one of his children. Dad's relationship with his children had been somewhat turbulent over the years, and he felt the need to sort that out. He set off with an envelope for each child detailing his individual message for each one of them. The first child was not at home, but the other three were. The part that spoke to me about the movie was that each child appeared as an adult when we saw them for the first time. But, when the person walked towards Robert De Niro's character the person appeared briefly as a little boy or little girl and would flash back to being an adult.

If God were to seek us out with an individual message, how might God see each one of us as we approach? Would God see us as we see ourselves, or the way other people see us? Would we flash from adulthood to childhood right before God's presence? I wish I had an answer for that. I do know that God sees each one of us the way we are, with our complexities, our joys and sorrows, and our childlike innocence.

At the end of the movie all of the father's children arrived at his home for Christmas dinner. Each one had previously tried to hide their true selves from him because they did not want to be a disappointment their dad. Now, they are gathered around his table, and we see them as dad sees them—loved no matter what, and that is how God sees each one of us.

September Task Of the Month

Seal Large Air Leaks. Sealing air leaks will reduce heating and cooling costs and provide other benefits. The most common places for air leaks are around door and windows, but leaks can also be found around chimneys, recessed lights and light fixtures, attic entrances, electric wires and boxes, vents and fans, plumbing utilities, water and furnace flues, and electrical outlets.

In addition to saving energy, sealing leaks reduces drafts, improves indoor air quality and fire safety and keeps your home comfortable longer during power outages (such as an ice storm). For more information, see the Creation Care bulletin board in the main hallway. Estimated savings: \$80 per year.

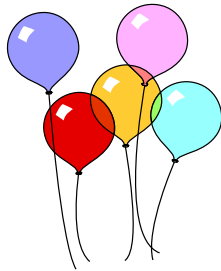
