Father's Day

Dear High Streeters:

I write this on the Monday prior to Father's Day with plans to go visit my father in an assisted living facility in Kokomo on Friday. Dad is 87 and battling Parkinson Disease. If he is in another room when I arrive, he will make his way painfully slowly and gingerly with the aid of his walker out to his small living room. The transition from the walker into his recliner is also slow and somewhat precarious.

As I sit and visit with my dad, I can't help but focus now and again on one photo near the wall opposite me. On the floor sits a nice wooden, hinged gallery of photos. Old family photos are displayed, featuring both sides of the family, mom and dad's wedding photo, and some early photos of my siblings and me. But the one photo that captures my attention is the one of my dad when he was in the Navy.

Dad looks so young and vibrant. He has a full head of hair; I barely remember him with a full head of hair. Dad graduated from high school in 1945. He was captain of the basketball team and tells me he dated a cheerleader. When he joined the Navy, the war was really over, but officially he is considered a World War II veteran. Dad served on the U.S.S. Missouri; by the time Dad boarded her, she was sailing up and down the Atlantic. (Getting on board the Mighty Mo is on my bucket list and will be my primary reason for going to Hawaii some day. I want to see where dad served.)

I am sure that photo leaps out at me because of the contrast to the man I now see. Now that once vibrant young man who loved sports remains unaware of

when his favorite teams are playing and how they are doing. During each visit I respond to his questions about the photos we have supplied him of our own children and grandchildren. He struggles most to keep straight his two youngest great-granddaughters. But I do appreciate that my dad always asks about how the family is doing. He doesn't remember what I tell him. And so, he asks a few times. But he still cares enough about them to ask and usually by name.

As our visit draws to a close, I ask him if he has any bills for me. He hands me envelopes, one or two of which may contain a bill. I have his check book and pay his bills. He stands. We hug. I give him a kiss. We each tell the other: "I love you." He then with the aid of his walker takes a step or two closer to the window to look down upon the parking lot. "What are you driving?" he asks. He sold cars for a number of years in his life, and for most of those years sold Buicks. "I'm driving that red Buick down there." "Do you like it?" "Yes, I do."

We share some more parting words as I head toward the door. He tells me to be sure to say "hello" to Cathy and the kids. He thanks me for coming to see him. I leave not sure he will really recall that I have been there. But I remember. I remember so much more than what I have shared with you here. I remember and know that I have been loved and continue to be loved by that man who once sailed the Atlantic on the Missouri and now holds onto a walker. Thanks, Dad.

Indiana Annual Conference

May 28 - 30, 2015, Indianapolis Convention Center, Indiana

INDIANAPOLIS – “Share Your Story” was the theme of the 2015 Indiana Annual Conference held Thursday through Saturday, May 28-30, at the Indiana Convention Center in downtown Indianapolis. The three-day event had an intentional focus to equip and empower individuals to share their personal stories of faith with the world around them using Joel 1:3 as the scripture reference, which reads, “Tell your children of it, and let your children tell their children, and their children to another generation.”

Bishop Michael J. Coyner called the conference into session at 1:45 p.m. Thursday, May 28, with more than 2,000 members and guests in attendance.

During the 2015 Celebration of Ministry: Ordination and Commissioning service, Louisiana Bishop Cynthia Fierro Harvey challenged those to be ordained “be who you are, and I promise the spirit will spin it, churn it, twist it and weave it into a story of legacy. You have a story to tell – of super-natural calling, of sacrifice, of joy, of suffering – and the moving of the spirit.”

George Howard, deputy general secretary of the United Methodist Board of Global Ministries, led teaching sessions during the day Friday, May 29 for laity and clergy reminding members that faith forming relationship is the growing edge in Christian mission and ministry today. Howard noted that the poor must be a priority for United Methodist worldwide in keeping our Wesleyan tradition.

Rev. Dr. Carver McGriff, a retired elder of the Indiana Conference, preached the memorial sermon Friday, May 28, and shared, “Grief is a terrible experience, yet, also, it’s a wonderful experience because it is the greatest experience we can give to a person we love.”

Paula and Ed Kassig, parents of the late Abdul-Rahman “Peter” Kassig, spoke at the annual prayer breakfast Saturday, May 30, and shared how prayer has sustained them through

the loss of their son. The Kassigs are members of Epworth UMC in Indianapolis.

During business sessions, conference members also:

- Received updates on the work of the Africa University Campaign to raise \$1 million to endow a chairperson for the Faculty of Agriculture and Natural Resources, as well as scholarships for students in the amount of \$600,000. Revs. Bill Keith, Chiyona Bourne and Matt Landry shared about the Indiana delegations recent trip to present the \$1 million check and updated the body on the remainder of the campaign. The report also included a video with interviews from students directly supported by the Indiana Conference.

- Celebrated the 100 Points of Light initiative, launched in 2014, as well as the 103 points of light that were successfully launched throughout the state of Indiana. Each point of light represents a new worship service, Bible study or other organized effort to reach new people with the light of Christ.

- In conjunction with the 100 Points of Light celebration, the conference also launched a new effort “I Have a Story to Tell” encouraging members to share their faith story or what God is doing in their life with others. More information about this initiative can be found at iwillsharethestory.org.

The conference ordained one deacon and 12 elders, as well as commissioned four provisional deacons and 11 provisional. The conference also retired 38 elders, deacons and local pastors from active ministry and remembered 41 clergy and 34 clergy spouses who had died this past conference year.

Throughout the conference members were engaged with video interviews from various leaders sharing their stories of how they came to know more about their personal faith or how they share faith with others.

High Street UMC was represented by Louise Dennin, Jim Mahoney, and Tom McDaniel. Kristy Mahoney and Kasey Needham participated as lay equalization members from the East District. Dick Stowe was sharing the work of the Indiana UMC Archives in one of the display areas.

Christ House Thank You!

Dear Friends,

Thank you for your recent gift of \$500.00, which will provide lifesaving care at Christ House. Your kindness gives patients like Carl the care and attention that is crucial for breaking out of dangerous cycles.

Carl was referred to Christ House from a homeless shelter nurse who knew that he needed medical care beyond what they could offer. Carl, only 26 years old, was experiencing a repeating cycle of health crises and hospital stays. Christ House learned of his unmanaged schizophrenia, seizure disorder, and drug addiction, and knew the nurse was right to refer him.

The Christ House medical team worked diligently to keep Carl on his mental health medications and his seizure disorder under control. The patient care team agreed that Carl was extremely vulnerable and needed to stay at Christ House until an appropriate placement and treatment was set up for his departure. Carl's case manager determined that, even though he was under the care of a legal guardian and mental health agency, his past treatments were not sufficient for his needs. If Carl's treatment plan didn't change, he would fall right back into a cycle of health crises. The case manager enrolled Carl in an intensive, 24-7 mental health program and petitioned for an expedited placement in a group home. With these two support systems in place, the team felt comfortable sending Carl to his new home.

When treatment and systems prove to be ineffective for a patient, someone must

make the decision to pursue new options. Our medical team went the extra mile to be sensitive to Carl's fragile condition and the case manager advocated for more appropriate support services. Thank you for partnering in our work to break patients out of dangerous cycles.

Your very generous gift will be matched by another donor.

Janelle and I thank you for your faithful support. We will be celebrating our 50th Anniversary of our Wedding on June 12, which took place at High Street Church.
