# Building On the Bones

I share with you two thoughts coming off of a much-appreciated and enjoyed vacation. The first thought comes as a result of taking the ghost tour in Savannah. Cathy and I boarded the 7:00 p.m. trolley tour of Savannah for an evening of ghost stories, including dinner at the Pirates' House and a visit down in its rum cellar through which pirates smuggled their rum into Savannah and kidnapped out drunk men to work their ships.

Our driver for this tour instructed us that at times she would ask, "What are we driving on?" And we were to respond loudly, "Bones." It was literally the truth in cases. For example, when the city had dug up Albercorn Street, which runs alongside Colonial Park Cemetery, they found buried bodies.

Of course, more than the city of Savannah is built upon those people of the past. Cathy and I were sure to travel Albercorn Street in order to see the statue of John Wesley on Reynolds Square and to see the Wesley Monumental UMC near Calhoun Square.

Earlier on vacation we had been in Fort Sumter, as we toured Charleston. We visited Bonaventure Cemetery while in Savannah. While not all of our vacation was history-related, we were reminded of how our lives are built upon the "bones" of those who have gone before us.

The second thought comes from having communication so readily available to us. I have a smart phone and could see that my church-related e-mails were mounting, but I remained disciplined enough not to open any of them. I was on vacation and had two capable pastors back here tending the flock. If something happened where

I were absolutely needed, they could text me. Now my smart phone came in handy to locate restaurants and to look up some sites on the internet. Cathy had her phone with her and would text with family and friends.

The temptation is to allow our conveniences to take charge of us. One author I read suggested that our cell phones are actually becoming the "significant other" for many of us. You have seen it happen. A couple is seated across from each other at a restaurant, and one of them spends all of his or her time on their smart phone. Communication as a couple just doesn't seem to take place. I suspect that the person we are with is usually more important at the time than the others that are not with us. It's about being truly present to each other. And it's about keeping everything in its proper place. To paraphrase Someone Else, "Smart phones are made for us, not us for the smart phones."

I know that is more easily said than done. But done it needs to be; for God's Spirit is with us in the present and is with us when we relate to each other. As Christians we need to be in the present and in the Presence.

Well, there are a couple of thoughts from our time away. Cathy and I thoroughly enjoyed our vacation. Now we are both back to work, hopefully building on the "bones" of those who have gone before us and being present and in his Presence.

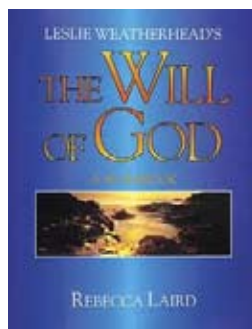

## Stevenson Center Open House and Consecration

With a projected completion date now of August 16 and with the Angels on High Preschool and Parents Day Out ministry preparing to open on Tuesday, September 3, we are scheduling Sunday, August 25, 4:00 – 6:00 p.m. for a brief service of consecration and a community open house. Church members and the community are invited to stop by and walk through this wonderfully renovated facility.

The Angels on High Preschool Board in its meeting July 22 approved expanding the Parents Day Out times to 7:00 a.m. through 5:30 p.m. and the hiring of a well-qualified teaching staff that is being put in place. Preschool registrations at that point numbered 68, which is just short of our record-setting enrollment last year for Angels on High Preschool. This places us in a position actually to exceed any previous enrollment by the time September arrives.

Not only are we expanding our weekday children's ministry through offering Parents Day Out, we also are expanding through two new classes. One of those new classes will allow the 4-5 year olds to spend more time in the preschool setting just to help better prepare them for full-day kindergarten next year. The other new class is for those children currently old enough to begin kindergarten but could benefit from an additional year of preparation. 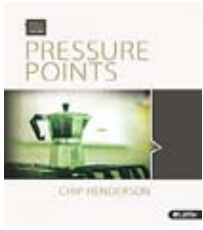
