The Waiting Room

When it was evening on that day, the first day of the week, and the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear . . . (John 20:19a)

This is the way John's gospel begins the story of the first appearance of the risen Christ to his disciples. Mary Magdalene had encountered Christ early on that day, but Jesus' students, followers and friends are huddled together, trying to make sense of all that has happened. Jesus has been crucified. The gospel says that they were behind locked doors for fear of the Jews, but I suspect the threat of Pilate, and Herod, and Roman soldiers with the authority to round up and crucify more of the "rabble rousers" would have been in their minds, also. Every hope, every plan, every early indicator of the coming reign of God seemed to have gone awry. Things were in a mess. Until Christ himself appears in their midst.

The season between the splendor of Easter and the birth of the church at Pentecost is a kind of waiting room in the church year. At Advent, we eagerly anticipate the coming of the Lord. During Epiphany, we celebrate the Christ who has come for all peoples. In the season of Lent, we reflect on our lives and how we can deepen our relationship with God. During the Sundays after Pentecost (sometimes called "Ordinary Time") we buckle down, and get to the business of living day to day in the light of our Christian faith. But what about Eastertide? What about the season of "in-between" before we are launched as a church, yet after we have proclaimed him as our Risen Lord?

It seems to me that a waiting room is a good metaphor for all the chaotic times in life when we have seen great hope, yet have not yet grasped its full meaning. Sitting in doctor's waiting rooms, we know the challenge when the good news we longed for meets the reality of disappointment, or even despair. Yet sometimes those same waiting rooms are the places just before we are ushered in to hear that we are released from treatment, that pain is a thing of the past, that new life is a possibility.

John's gospel is not explicit about just what it is the disciples do in that locked, fear-filled room, but we do get an intriguing hint. "Now Jesus did many other signs in the presence of his disciples, which are not written in this book. But these are written so that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name." (John 20:30-31)

Eventually, the disciples open the door. Some return to the seaside. They meet the risen Christ again. Peter receives marching orders to "feed my sheep." Life begins again, but now in a new way – a "Risen Christ" way. And soon the church is "born," and the story spreads.

Maybe at High Street we can draw close to each other when we go through the "waiting room." At times in life when we're unsure, when we've seen glimpses of hope, but are not yet ready to grab them for ourselves, then it will be most important to have a community around us "holding the faith for us" while we wait.

Call to Christ

Who: Kids grade 5 through grade 10.

What: Sing and learn musical skills and musical traditions of the church around the world.

When: August through mid-May

Rehearsal each Wednesday, 6:00-6:50pm

Sunday mornings about once each month.

Where: Rehearse in the Choir Room (Ground floor).

Why: Ephesians 5:19 states: "Speaking to one another with psalms, hymns, and songs from the Spirit, sing and make music from your heart to the Lord."

Congregational Singing

Who: Everyone.

What: Singing psalms, hymns, and spiritual songs.

When: Weekly in worship at 8:30, 9:45, and 11:00am.

Easter and Advent Orchestras

Who: Anyone who plays a wind, string, or percussion instrument and can read music.

What: These musicians bolster the congregational hymns during these two festive seasons.

When: One Sunday in Advent and one at (or around) Easter. Rehearsal is announced, typically for the preceding Saturday. Sunday meeting is 7:45am to play for worship at 8:30am.

Where: Sanctuary.

Why: This beloved High Street tradition elevates our worship during key seasons of the year.

Chancel Handbells

Who: Anyone 16 or older

What: Ringing bells in a church has been a signal of worship for centuries. The current custom of ringing handbells in America came to prominence in the 1940s. Each person in the ensemble plays a vital role in the final offering. Rudimentary music-reading skills are recommended.

When: August through mid-May

Rehearsal each Wednesday, 5:45-7:00pm

Sunday mornings approximately once each month, meet at 7:30am to ring in worship at 8:30 and 9:45 (finished before 10:00).

Where: 3rd floor classroom - 303

Why: To share our musical talents with the congregation, each other, and ring praises, because it's fun to make music together!

Resounding Mercy

Who: Anyone 16 or older.

What: Sing or play in support of worship.

When: Each Sunday of the year. Rehearsal each Sunday, 9:45-10:30am. Each Sunday morning, sing and play for worship in the Sanctuary at 11:00am.

Where: Rehearsal in the Choir Room (Ground floor); worship in the Sanctuary.
Why: Psalm 150 concludes: "Praise God with trumpet sound, praise him with lute and harp! Praise him with tambourine and dance; praise him with strings and pipe! Praise him with clanging cymbals; praise him with loud clashing cymbals! Let everything that breathes praise the Lord!"

Angels on High Preschool Mid-April Update

The Lotion Company Fundraiser

Angels on High Preschool & PDO has started their spring fundraiser. The money raised will be used to purchase items for our preschool classrooms and to support our scholarship account.

For this fundraiser we will be selling lotions from a local Muncie business, The Lotion Company. The company makes hand-crafted lotion in small kettles to ensure consistency and is available in 9 different scents. The lotion is made with macadamia nut oil, aloe vera and sesame seed oil. The recipe is a 30 years old family tradition and contains no animal product, no petroleum and no mineral oil, which is the main ingredient for other lotions which causes the greasy film left behind once applied. Each bottle of lotion is 18 ounces. One bottle is sold for \$16, two bottles are sold for \$28 and three bottles are sold for \$40 with a free 2 ounce travel bottle. This 18 ounce product sells at many other locations for \$20. This fundraiser provides our school with 50% of the profit from each bottle sold! Please feel free to sample the lotions, as we have a sample caddy at the front desk.

Please know that it is always voluntary to participate and we appreciate all of your support! If you would like to make a monetary donation instead of purchasing lotions, please feel free to do so. You can do this through check, cash, or by credit card (just call the preschool at 765-216-7919). Checks should be made out to Angels on High Preschool.

There is an order form in the church office and orders will be taken through April 22. Lotions will be delivered the following week, again in the church office. These make great gifts for Mother's Day and teacher gifts!

A FRUITFUL CONGREGATION JOURNEY UPDATE

Recently most of our FCJ Team Facilitators met with our coach, Doug Anderson, along with Pastors Dale and Sherrie. Here is a list of what has happened and is projected to happen out of our Fruitful Congregation Journey process:

- We have reconfigured our staff to meet priorities by hiring a Director of Children's Ministries and a Director of Older Adult Ministries
- The Director of Children's Ministries, the Director of Youth Ministries, our Preschool Director, and Pastor Sherrie meet on a regular basis as a Family Ministry staff and are participating along with a few others in the Conference-sponsored Family Ministry Cohort.
- The staff sets and reports on quarterly goals.
- A Connect Team has been formed. It has created a handout for guests and will be identifying and training roamers in our worship services and hospitality persons in our classes in order to provide a more welcoming environment.
- The Library staff is conducting an inventory of its books and looking to expand its resources.
- A Missions Committee has been formed. This group is sponsoring monthly missions speakers in our worship services and will be producing a missions brochure. It also will be coordinating our mission teams and efforts.
- Our All-Church-Activities-Committee has moved to sponsoring quarterly fellowship events for our church.

- A Young Adult/Families Class has formed and also has activities as a group.
- Our Discipleship Process Team has charted a process. Pastors are leading “A Disciple’s Path” for prospective members, “A Disciple’s Heart” to continue growth in the disciplines, and “Followers Become Leaders” to encourage leadership development. The Team also sponsors Saturday morning workshops in spiritual disciplines, is collaborating with Children’s Ministries in formulating a discipleship process for children, will be providing guided meditations on our church website, and is exploring a Taize service.
- The Small Group Team has sponsored a couple of events to promote the forming of small groups, and we are seeing new small groups arising.
- The Facilities Investigation Team is collaborating with the Trustees and our Preschool to explore providing a children’s ministries area on one floor. In addition the Youth Ministries Team is collaborating with the Youth Council and the Trustees to expand and update the Youth areas of our church.

The above list may not be all-inclusive, but it does serve as a reminder of what we have emerging out of our FCJ process. We are grateful to all who have been involved in so many ways in revitalizing our ministries so that we are making disciples for the transformation of the world.
