Dear High Street Friends:

All four gospel writers tell us about Peter's denials of Jesus, but only Matthew tells it in a way that particularly struck home with me after spending a couple of weeks in England. Peter was outside in the courtyard as Jesus was inside being interrogated by the high priest. Two different servant girls had fingered Peter as one of Jesus' followers. Peter denied it both times. Then Matthew tells us (26:73): After a little while the bystanders came up and said to Peter, "Certainly you are also one of them, for your accent betrays you."

Newly arrived in Manchester, England and with a GPS that itself was lost, we stopped to ask directions of a woman sitting in a car in a parking lot. She couldn't provide any as she was from Scotland, but when her husband got off the phone, she asked him if he could help "this man from New York." It's the first time anyone has ever said I sounded like I was from New York.

Days later visiting an estate with lovely gardens, Cathy informally engaged a young mother with her preschool son in conversation. They came to this estate frequently. The little boy was interested in how the tadpoles were growing. When Cathy jokingly remarked that we thought we were the only ones without an accent, the young mother responded that we definitely have an accent.

In London in attempting to locate a residence where some of Cathy's relation had lived prior to coming to the USA, I asked

a young man if he knew where this particular address was. He was very gracious. He handed me his smartphone and asked me to type in the address. I realized then that he didn't fully understand me because of my accent.

We found generally people caught on quite readily that we were not local tourists. We have this accent. Even when in a restaurant in Liverpool when we ordered lemonade, the server, who was fun and spoke British English so rapidly that we only could understand portions of what he said, readily identified us as Americans and knew there could be a problem. He wanted to make sure we understood what a lemonade was. We Americans expect a cloudy drink. But a lemonade there meant a Sprite with a lemon in it. And that is what we had with our meal.

There were times when we suspected we were being engaged in conversation or being treated with extra attention because of our accents. Often we were asked where we were from and found ourselves explaining where Indiana is in relationship to Chicago. In London we ran into a family from Oklahoma a couple of times and enjoyed conversing with people who sounded a lot like us.

A question arose in our minds as we obviously were perceived as having an accent. We wondered how it is we truly sound to people who don't have the same accent. We don't really know. How we

speak is such a part of us that we don't really hear our accent as others would.

Peter was recognized because of his Galilean accent. He probably hadn't expected that to give him away. His accent made the bystanders suspect he was a follower of Jesus Christ.

It all makes me wonder, no matter from where we come or the language we speak or the matter in which we speak it, if being a follower of Jesus Christ isn't something that becomes such a part of us that even unknowingly we give ourselves away. This Christ-like accent, if you will, lets others know there is something different about us. And then I wonder if and how I might sound to people who don't have the same accent.
