## Moving Toward a Day Care

What happens when your Parents Day Out ministry becomes so popular that Angels on High finds itself caring for children for more than four hours per day (this includes preschool) for ten week days in a row? You are required to register as a day care ministry. So Angels on High and our church are cooperating in moving in that direction.

Pastor Gilbert and Rebecca Swander, Angels on High Director, will attend a state-conducted child care ministry training in Indianapolis. We will begin completing the necessary forms to get registered. Our goal is to be registered in time for our summer program.

What do we do with the children who are involved in Parents Day Out in the meantime? On Thursdays of each week, beginning March 24, High Street Church will be offering an alternative Parents Day Out in the church building itself. Our church has a long-standing history of offering such a ministry through our nursery and will expand our existing ministry to offer this alternative for parents and children on Thursdays.

### Victory at the Women's Prison to Victory in Africa

The High Street Joy in the Harvest mission team going to Africa will be taking 50 mosquito nets with them to be installed at the Victory in Jesus Camp (formerly called the Destitute Camp) which provides love and care for individuals with disabilities. The mosquito nets will save lives by preventing the spread of malaria. The really amazing thing is that the nets are being made by the women at the Women's Prison in Indianapolis where High Streeters are involved in the prison ministry VICTORY (Acronym for Volunteers in Christ - Transformed, Obedient, Redeemed and Yielded)! We're looking for 50 people or groups willing to give \$15 to cover the cost of one net (or more!) to connect these two victory ministries. Donations can be made at Sunday offerings or at the office but should be marked "mosquito nets".
