A Soldier of the Garden

As the complexion of autumn's face begins to color our world, this season reveals God's truth in the harmony of nature. As the tree graciously frees its leaves, God can remind us to "let go" of old ideas; cleaning out a garage or attic, or releasing hurtful memories of the past. Sometimes in autumn, God will show us a fruitful season of harvest time; a job well done in planting seeds for a bountiful harvest. Sometimes in September, a cold wind will jog our memory to what is coming in winter; a prompt to put away the summer gear; to protect the sensitive plantings from the harshness of winter, and prepare in mind and spirit for the bleak, stark, grayness of winter.

As I contemplated on the truths of nature, and the coming of autumn, one particular flower seemed to speak to me from my back yard. A soldier of sorts in the garden, standing tall and upright guarding the harvest; protecting the fruit, and watching for intruders; a familiar bloom soaring high above the ground, touching the clouds and sky; A popular blossom displayed on dishes, tablecloths, and pillows. Even famous artists like Picasso, and Van Gogh saw its beauty. I'm talking about the sunflower.

This message of truth came to me one evening as I was in my front yard swing, and as the sun settled in the western sky, a poem began to write on my heart about the sunflower, and the beauty of God's truth revealed through this simple flower.

In the warmth of the day, the sunflower tracks the sun. Most plants are attracted to light, but the flowering head of

the sunflower actually tracks the sun following its path and moving toward where it is in the sky all during the day. As followers of Christ, we are to keep our eyes on the Son; following the path of the Son, moving ever closer to the Light.

Sunflowers need to be stabilized. Sunflowers grow tall, and their stems become heavy and they can topple over if they aren't planted firmly in the soil. Just like us, we can tumble over in the storms of life. We need to be planted firmly in the Word of God.

Sunflowers produce seeds. Did you know that one sunflower can have up to 2000 seeds? When we think about sowing seeds as a Christian, think of the potential reach that each of us can have in spreading the Good News.

Sunflowers produce oil. The oil that sunflowers produce is considered good oil with healthy benefits. As Christians, we carry the Holy Spirit which in scripture represents oil which soothes, comforts, and nourishes those who are hurting.

Sunflowers resemble the sun. Sunflowers not only follow the sun but when you look at them they resemble the sun with its round center, and petals as sunbeams. Hopefully, as believers we resemble the Son; being Christ like in nature and spirit.

When I think about the lessons from the sunflower, I am amazed at the Creator of Life revealing to me such truth and beauty. May He give you a revelation too of His truth through the beauty of nature.

Upcoming changes in traffic flow

Rod Stover and I just met with Howard McClanahan from Brooks, the company digging up the downtown streets and installing new pipes. Here is my understanding of what will happen.

1. As soon as Brooks can, they will start work at the intersection of Adams and Franklin and work east on Adams. Therefore, in the near future (yet this month) our Adams Street entrance will be closed. Traffic coming into our church lot will need to enter off of High Street. Angels on High parents will be asked to enter High Street, jog to the right in our lot, pick up their children on the passenger side of their vehicles, and then exit onto Franklin Street.

2. Not long after, work will begin on the block of Franklin Street just west of the church. Just before that happens, Brooks will construct an exit for us onto Jackson Street close to the Stevenson Center. Brooks will remove the posts and the chain (and will restore them later) to make room for this exit. This means the Angels on High parents will enter off of High Street, go straight into our lot, then turn right in front of the Stevenson Center for their children to be picked up on the driver's side. They then can exit onto Jackson Street, heading east.

3. When the Jackson Street exit is operable, there will be no through traffic approaching from the west. The intersection of Jackson and Franklin will be closed.

4. Brooks is going to request that the block of Jackson Street to our north become two-way; so as to allow people to turn off of High Street and access the Ivy Tech lot north of us. (This should help us with parking on Sunday morning.)

5. Brooks will be going 18' deep on Franklin Street. Obviously we won't use the Ivy Tech

lot west of us on Sunday mornings. Casey has already received permission from Ivy Tech to use their lot north of us (across Jackson) on Sunday mornings.

6. We do have permission to use our parking tags for Update Learning for the city lot just east of the church across High Street. The tags will allow a car to be parked in that lot for longer than the two-hour limit. These, of course, are good only on the Mondays of Update Learning and should be used only for the actual length of time someone is attending Update Learning.
