Come, Take, and Learn

Dear Friends in Christ:

I am old enough to remember the Ed Sullivan Show. At times on that variety show there would be a man who would spin a number of plates. He would place a plate on top of a thin, flexible pole and then spin that plate. Then he would do the same for another plate and so on. As he got multiple plates spinning, he would have to run back to earlier-spun plates to give them another spin. The goal of the act was to get all the plates spinning at once. It was a frenetic act.

Do you ever feel like that is the way life is for you? Whether you are taking classes and trying to balance that work with other activities or working and trying to get your children to all of their activities or wondering how you ever got much of anything done before you retired from your job, you may find yourself spinning multiple plates. I certainly do at times.

And then I hear Jesus say: *Come to me, all you that are weary and are carrying heavy burdens, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me; for I am gentle and humble in heart, and you will find rest for your souls. For my yoke is easy, and my burden is light.* (Matthew 11:28-30)

Jesus asks three things of us: Come, Take, Learn. In doing those three things, we will find rest. It's not that we won't be doing anything anymore.

But the Jesus-given burden will be light.

This passage was shared as the opening devotion at the last Peer Mentoring session that I attend monthly at our Conference Office in Indianapolis. This group is for pastors of churches of comparable size going through step three of the Fruit Congregation Journey.

This passage and the devotion led me to think about what we are doing here at the church. Our various ministry areas are performing ministry audits. Our staff is writing mission-focused, results-based ministry descriptions that will be audited. The point is that all of us as staff and as a church are prioritizing; we are doing what is important to our mission and vision and not crowding out what is important for that which is not so important.

Maybe Lent is a good time to be doing that in our personal lives. Maybe Jesus' invitation is really one in which with him as Lord, we will clarify what is truly important in life and prioritize accordingly.

May we hear Jesus invite us anew this season to Come, Take, and Learn. And may we find what it means to rest in him.

EASTER SUNDAY OFFERING BEYOND EBOLA - HUNGER CAMPAIGN

For more than 25 years, Operation Classroom has been in partnership with The United Methodist Church of Liberia and Sierra Leone to improve Secondary Education to students. OC provides scholarships that assist students who would otherwise be unable to attend school, to obtain an education. Throughout the course of this ministry, OC has shipped more than 100 containers of school and medical supplies to both countries, as well as deployed Volunteers In Mission teams of Hoosiers to offer assistance. Operation Classroom has served as a vital part of developing future leaders for the continent of Africa and the world.

However, the recent Ebola crisis in West Africa has taken great toll on the students, staff and staff families of supported United Methodist schools. Thus, OC is compelled to engage in relief. “We really have no choice,” said OC President Bob Coolman, “But to engage in relief – especially hunger relief - until this scourge is brought under control. It’s literally an ‘all hands on deck’ approach to an incredibly grave issue.” Schools have been closed in both Liberia and Sierra Leone since last May, because of the restrictions placed on large group gatherings, so teachers and school administrators have not been paid for nearly eight months. There are roughly 500 United Methodist Schools in the two countries – which means that thousands of teachers and staff persons have no means of taking care of their families. In countries where teachers are typically paid only about \$100/ month to begin with, hunger becomes an enormous issue.

In a joint effort, the bishops of Liberia and Sierra Leone along with Operation Classroom

and the Indiana Conference are asking for your help in tackling hunger and feeding our brothers and sisters who are suffering. Now is our time to help those who have given so much to make a difference in the lives of their students. Funds raised by the “Beyond Ebola – Hunger” campaign will be used as follows:

- Emergency Food Purchases for:
 - Persons in quarantine (otherwise, quarantine is a death sentence)
 - Persons in Ebola Treatment Centers at United Methodist medical facilities
 - Persons in United Methodist hospitals (Hospitals in West African do not have food service – families must provide meals for their loved ones who are hospitalized.)
 - Teachers in UM Schools who have not been paid since last May, because schools have been closed.
- Emergency shipping of donated food (It is generally less expensive to purchase food in-country, but when food is donated, it does make sense to ship it.) To date almost \$85,000 of Rice MannaPacks from “Feed My Starving Children” has been donated to Operation Classroom, constituting more than 400,000 meals. Those shipments are even now on their way to West Africa – with more to go, if funding is available.
- At least SOME payment of teachers (so they can feed their families;) Operation Classroom (through the giving of many Indiana United Methodist Churches and individuals) has already provided nearly \$25,000 of funding for this purpose – but given the magnitude of the situation, this does not even come close to addressing the problem.

CHANGE: It is said to be one of the constants in life. But how do we deal with change? In order to deal with change successfully, we need to be able to manage the transitions in life.

Think about it.

Moses led the people out of slavery in Egypt but it then took forty years to get Egypt out of the people. It took forty years to transition the people who had been slaves for generations into people ready for their new life in the Promised Land.

Jesus called the disciples away from their daily lives to spend three years with him. Following his death and resurrection, it took another fifty days before they were ready for Pentecost.

Join us as we explore some keys to managing the transitions in our lives.

An Introduction of Raul Prieto Ramirez

Critics have hailed Raul Prieto Ramirez as one of the most exciting talents on the music scene in Spain. His concert schedule takes him to major festivals and concert halls, including the Mariinsky Theater, the Moscow Concert Hall, the Spivey Hall, the Kotzschmar Organ Series, the Methuen Memorial Music Hall, and the American Guild of Organists' 2012 National Convention. Mr. Ramírez was appointed at age 27 as the first Organist-in-Residence of the Auditorio Nacional de Música in Madrid—Spain's National Concert Hall. Within the first six months of his appointment, he increased attendance at the hall's organ recitals by a multiple of 30. Since September 2013, Mr. Ramírez has been a member of the music faculty at Ball State University. He continues as the artistic director of the annual summer International Organ Festival Mataró-Barcelona, where he attracts audiences of more than 1,200 people to his concerts. He also pursues a busy concert schedule that takes him to major festivals and concert halls around the world—from St. Petersburg's Mariinsky Theater and the Moscow Concert Hall, to organ dedications, AGO conventions, Spivey Hall, the Kotzschmar Organ Series, and Methuen Memorial Music Hall in the United States.

Mr. Ramírez has been widely recorded and interviewed for radio and television in several European countries and in America. His first two compact discs,

on the Brilliant Classics label, were recorded at Milan Cathedral in Italy and at the famous Palau de la Música Catalana in Barcelona.

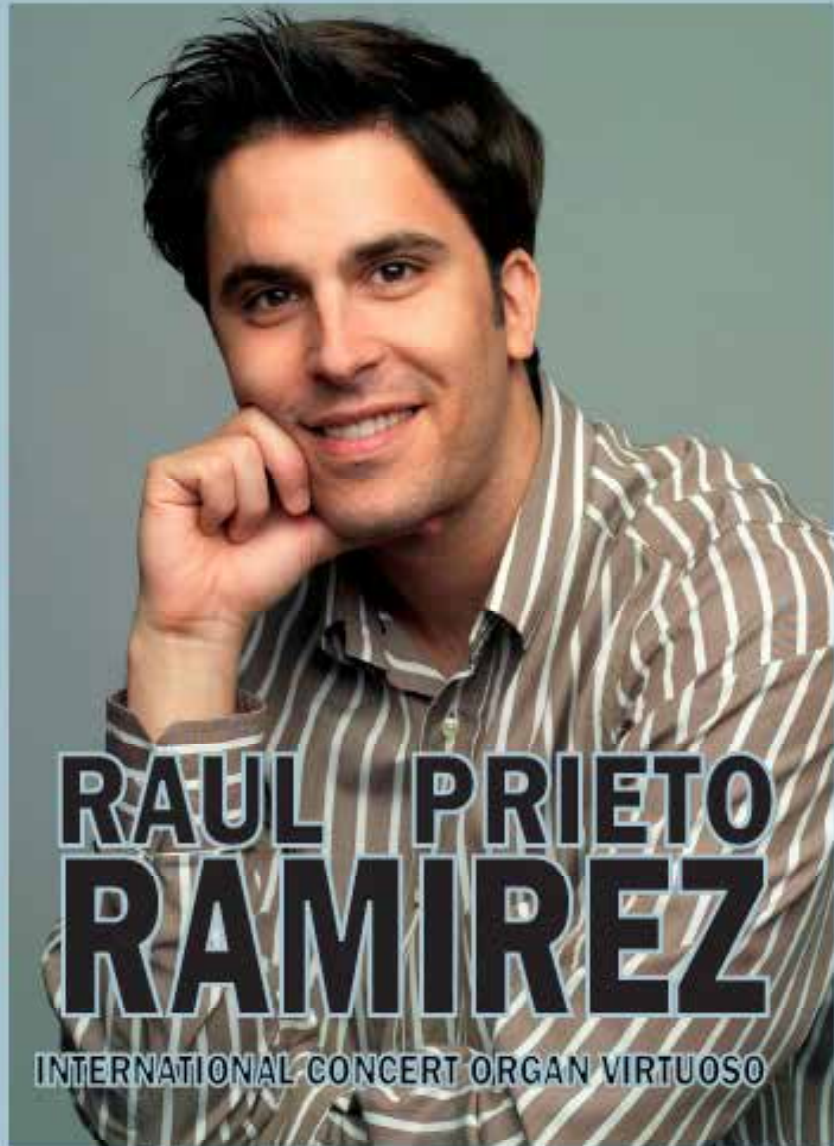

OUR RENOVATED ORGAN

The pipe organ at High Street United Methodist Church was built in 1931 by Ernest M. Skinner, one of the greatest American organ builders of the twentieth century. When it was first built, the organ contained 40 ranks (complete sets) of pipes. Nearly destroyed in the 1978 gas explosion at High Street, it has been rebuilt and completed in stages over thirty-six years. Finally completed this year by Reynolds Associates, Inc., the organ now boasts 70 ranks of pipes and many state-of-the-art features, including a computerized control and memory system, as well as a magnificent new festival trumpet built of polished copper, its spun bells projecting from the rear wall of the church. Although the sound of the organ has been augmented to allow it to play a wider range of music for worship, it retains its elegant sound.
